### Cold War Recognition Certificate

In accordance with section 1084 of the Fiscal Year 1998 National Defense Authorization Act, the

Secretary of Defense approved awarding Cold War Recognition Certificates to all members of the armed forces and personnel who faithfully and honorably served the United States anytime during the Cold War era, which is defined as September 2, 1945, to December 26, 1991. The certificate may be awarded posthumously to those whose relatives apply on their behalf. National Guard and Reservists are eligible.
